

Scottish History



Robert the Bruce

Robert the Bruce was inspired to defeat the English at the battle of Bannockburn in 1314 after watching a spider spinning it's web.

In 1692 the MacDonalds of Glencoe had not taken an oath of loyalty. Campbell's soldiers stayed in their homes, then massacred them in their beds!
